



What Do We Do?

We are a non-profit organization dedicated to the safety and well-being of our furry counterparts. Each of the animals we have for adoption are what we call "Death Row Pets", meaning each one was in line for euthanasia quite often just minutes before we arrive at the shelter. Each of the pets we save are brought into a foster home where they are vetted, spayed/neutered, nursed back to health and learn that a home does not consist of concrete floors and iron bars. Afterward, each animal is put up for adoption to hopefully find their forever homes and a family that will love them like they deserve to be loved.

How Do We Afford it All?

The income we have comes solely from adoption fees and donations. Even then we often times do not break even. Vet bills can be extremely high and many of the animals we pull out of the shelter require surgery to survive. Adoption fees vary from animal to animal and from \$150-\$275.

Veterinary Costs per Animal:

Spay/Neuter:	\$75-\$150 (varies depending on size of animal)
Parvo/Distemper Shot:	\$15- \$28
Rabies Shot:	\$12-\$18
Food for a Month:	\$15-\$20
Heart Worm Testing:	\$45-\$50
Heart Worm Treatment:	\$15/ month

Total:	\$216

(for an average animal with no extra veterinary needs)

What if I Want to Adopt an Animal?

Each of our potential adopters must go through an application process. They must also fulfill the following requirements:

- 18 years of age with a current Driver's License or ID
- Landlord approval if you rent
- A fenced yard
- Permission of all adults living at the residence
- Other animals residing with you must be current on vaccinations and dogs must be on heartworm prevention



What Can I Do to Help?

Anyone can help in a number of ways! Pet foster parents and volunteers are always needed. If you do not have the extra time to dedicate to the animals, donations such as dog and cat food, cat litter, newspaper, toys and especially monetary donations to help with veterinary bills all can help a great deal!
